A Council held at the city of Annapolis on the 29th Day of
November 1756.

Stephen Bradley Esquire his Lordships Attorney General was then sent for by
Order of the Board and attended accordingly.

The Sheriff of Baltimore County having made a Return of the Warrant
directed to him from this Board the 13th Instant and the Persons therein named
being called in one after the other four of them were examined on oath and
deposed as follows:

John Critt of Baltimore County Planter being sworn on the body Evangelis
of Almighty God deponeth and saith that he has lived at New Creek in Baltimore
County within four miles of Mr Ignatius Whelwright ever since the Year 1752 that
he is a Roman Catholic and has gone to the Mass. House where Bennett Neale
resides, that the said Neale lives upon a plantation that was given by one Thomas
Shaw, that he has three or four Negroes; as he believes working upon it and that Mr
Neale has resided there about a year; this Deponent likewise saith that he doth not
remember anything either of one Johnson or Murphy as residing in that
neighbourhood during the aforesaid time except one Johnson a Wheelwright
who lives there now, this Deponent further saith that he knows James M^r Donald
Thomas Brugge, and Darby Tool, that Mr Donald is a poor Man has no Family
but himself and wife that he has only a little Hut, and does Shoemaker's work
for Samuel Webb, and he believes never made any Crop either of Cotton or Tobacco.
That Thomas Brugge has a wife, and several small Children but no Negroes or
servants, that he has a small plantation but is very poor, that Darby Tool is a
Shoemaker and works at his trade for Samuel Webb, that he has a wooden Leg
and that the Shoemaker's business is his chief Employment, that Brugge, and
Mr Donald live in the first and are very near Neighbours, he likewise saith
that this person now shown to him he doth not know to be either Johnson or
Murphy, this Deponent also saith that Mr Bennett Neale never told him
nor did he ever hear any other person say that one Mr Digenes who lived near
York in any other place Digenes had Arms or Ammunition by him and would be
of service if the French should come down, or that Mr Digenes would furnish
any Town with Arms or Ammunition to assist the French, or for any such
purpose, and he likewise says that he never heard any one say that Ulrich
Bruek
