Philip Comaury of Worcester County in the Province of Maryland aged thirty five  
Years or thereabouts being sworn on the holy Evangelis of almighty God Depoent & saith that about eighteen  
Years past he removed to the head of Nanticoke River and near unto the Branches of Deep Creek and the  
Branch of Suptoe County and that he is well acquainted with a Branch called and known by the name of  
Green Branch and that the Drains of the said Branch hath a communication with a Branch that maketh  
out of the head of Gravely Branch from whence also the Beaver Dams or Drains also issue and that he  
hath always understood and been informed that the aforesaid Drains or Beaver Dams or Drains were the  
reputed Bounds between the County of Suptoe and the County of Worcester in the Province of Maryland  
And this Depoent further saith that he also knows & is well acquainted with the Place formerly called  
the Mading Place on Gravely Branch where now is a Bridge and that that Place is six or seven miles  
within the reputed Bounds of Maryland and below the Beaver Dams & Drains aforesaid and that he never  
heard of that Place aforesaid of Gravely Branch being a boundary between the Counties of Suptoe and  
Worcester aforesaid neither did this Depoent ever hear or understand that any Lands thereabouts were  
claimed by a Pennsylvania Right And this Depoent further saith that he is one of the Labourers that work  
on the Road leading over the said Bridge & that the said Bridge hath been supported by the said Road  
for a considerable distance above the Bridge hath always been cleared by the People of Maryland & further  
this Depoent saith not.

Richard Crockett of Worcester County in the Province of Maryland Planter aged  
fifty one Years or thereabouts being sworn on the holy Evangelis of almighty God Depoent & saith that  
about nineteen Years past he settled at a Place on Gravely Branch on the Stream of which he built a great Mill  
about two hundred Yards above the Place formerly called the Mading Place and where a Bridge now is and  
that each side of the said Branch there was now is & always was as this Depoent hath been informed concerned  
and Accounted to be within the Province of Maryland & that he never heard or understood that it was within the  
County of Suptoe And this Depoent further saith that some time after he had settled on Gravely Branch aforesaid  
he removed & went to live within Suptoe County and did live there for the space of two Years and that he understood  
from & was informed by the People of Suptoe County aforesaid that the Place known & called by the Name of the Beaver  
Dams or Drains were the reputed Bounds between the County of Suptoe and the County of Worcester in the Province  
of Maryland which Beaver Dams or Drains are about seven Miles above the aforesaid Bridge where the aforesaid  
Mading Place was And this Depoent further saith that afterwards he removed back to the Place on Gravely  
Branch where he built his Mill aforesaid and where he now lives and that the aforesaid Bridge on Gravely  
Branch is seven or eight Miles within the Bounds of reputed Limits of the Province of Maryland and further  
this Depoent saith not.
