which as hath been already observed was sometimes so high as seventy and sometimes so low as fifty during the late War and as by the Act under which those Bills were emitted certain Duties and Taxes were laid which would certainly bring them into the Office to be sunk before the end of the year 1763 their value was never depreciated but continued rather to increase so that for some time before they were sunk six Shillings in such Bills paid in all payments was a Spanish Dollar or six Shillings American  
so as to sink these Bills the Act imposed a Stamp Duty a Duty on Negroes Horses  
Pitch Hair and Carpenter imported a Tax on Land and on Bachelors an Excise  
on spirituous Liquors and a Fine on Ordinary and Tavern Licences by which  
it hath been estimated Sixty Thousand Pounds hath been sunk so that after  
the 24th of September next there will be no paper money Bills of Credit circulating in  
the Province except such as have been emitted in the Neighbouring Colonies and may for want  
of a sufficient Quantity of specie in circulation be brought in and paid away to the Inhabitants  
of this Province.

Read the Report of the Conviction of a Negro Servant of the Reverend John Myquahet  
deceased whereby it appears the said Negro having recently had passed sentence of Death upon  
the said Negro in March last last year for a certain Burglary committed in breaking  
and entering the House of the said John Myquahet and stealing therefrom a considerable sum of  
Money and a Report of the Sheriff of the same County that the said Negro did was by the  
advice and Permission of some which Person's Province onto commit the said Burglary  
wherefore recommend the said Slave as a proper object of his Execution. Sirs.

Read the Conviction of a Negro Servant of John Stevenson of Baltimore County  
whereby it appears that the Sheriff of Baltimore County Court had passed sentence of Death  
upon the said Negro at last June Court for a certain Burglary committed in breaking  
and entering the House of the said John Stevenson and stealing therefrom two Barrels of Rum.  
wherefore

Ordered: Send Warrant for the Execution of the said Negro on Friday the 26th  
of this instant duly which is now accordingly.

Read the Conviction of a Negro Slave of William Homestey of Lucen James County  
whereby it appears that the Sheriff of Lucen James County Court had on the fourth Sunday in June  
last passed sentence of Death upon the said Negro for a certain Murder committed on  
the 1st of July of this instant.

Ordered: Send Warrant for the Execution of the said Negro on Wednesday the 21st  
of this instant duly which is now accordingly.
