

You have paid to the Message. I thought it my Duty to communicate to you last Night. That you  
are in on a full Foundation that part of my Message which relates to Col. Cresap, and the People  
who are said to have upon him in Arms at Frederick Town, was founded; I shall agreeable to  
your desire, perenth and you the copy of a Resolution that was made Yesterday, by Cap<sup>r</sup> "Bran  
Merry" with one of 17 Regt, relative to a Letter addressed to your House, that was, it seems intellij,  
handed about in Frederick County, and signed. Whether such Letter has even been presented to  
you know, you best know, if it has, the Author or Original. However if it might, suppose be easi-  
ly found, and you will, have reason to believe, on a proper Examination of Jacob Young, James  
Miller and others inhabitants of Frederick County, however how far Col. Cresap has been in-  
strumental in promoting measures that have a tendency to distract the Publick Peace, and to de-  
prive the several Principals of the Legislature of that Freedom of Debating and Judging, which  
is essential to the Constitution. What I intimated with regard to the Negro that live near Elk  
Bridge, was communicated to me by G<sup>r</sup> Will<sup>m</sup> Lux and W<sup>r</sup> John Burgess of that Place, a copy  
of whose information I likewise send you Inclosed. — Mr. Sharpe

the 2<sup>d</sup> instant, which is issued accordingly.

Sir

11 January 2d. Oct 1765.

It is with the greatest concern, that His Majesty learns the Disturbances  
which have arisen in some of the North American Colonies. If this evil should spread to the  
Government of Maryland, where you preside, the utmost exertion of your Prudence will be nece-  
ssary, to temper your Conduct between that Caution and Boldness, which the Delicacy of  
our situation may demand, on one hand, and the Vigour necessary to suppress Overage.
