

March 20<sup>th</sup> 1777

Ordered that the Western Shore Treasurer pay to John Green, one  
Pound, six shillings, and nine pence, for rent of his shop.

That the said Treasurer pay to Robert Green  
one thousand Pounds, on acct.

That the said Treasurer pay to John  
Baker Quarters one hundred and fifty Pounds, on acct.

Charles Canoth of Canothton Esq<sup>r</sup> from the  
Senate delivers to the Governor and Council, the memorial of the  
Rev<sup>d</sup> Mr. John Bowie, praying that the General Assembly  
would resume the consideration of his case; thus indorsed, "By the  
House of Delegates. March 28<sup>th</sup> 1777. read and referred to the Governor  
and Council, to determine whether the said Bowie be committed, bailed, or  
discharged, and that they have full power to commit, bail, or discharge  
in their discretion. G. Dewall S. S. D. By the Senate. March 20. 1777.  
Read and referred to the Governor and Council for the purposes aforesaid  
By order R. Ridgely S. S." which was ordered to lie on the Table.

The Petition of Daniel Johnson praying a Discharge  
from his Confinement was read, and rejected, the Council of Safety having  
reported to the General Assembly, that the Offense, with which he stands  
charged, is not bailable by Law.

Ordered, That the Western Shore Treasurer  
pay to Mrs. Archer of Harris, nine Pounds, and three pence, it  
being the Balance on Contract for Lucia's Rent.

On reading the Memorial of the Rev<sup>d</sup>  
Mr. John Bowie, it was ordered, that the Officer of the Guard,  
who has charge of the Rev<sup>d</sup> Mr. John Bowie immediately  
attend the Governor and Council, with the said Bowie in Custody.
