

Ordered that the warden shall hereafter pay to
George Gordon four Pounds for a Musquet.

Memorandum of an Agreement between
The Governor and Council of the State of Maryland on the
one Part, and Richard Bond of Cecil County of the other
Part. — Richard Bond agrees to manufacture and
make for the use of this State one thousand Gun - Barrels,
three Quarters of an Inch in the Bore, and three and an
half Inch in the Bore, with litchlock and locked, and
otherwise completely fitted, finished and proved, ready for
firing, for which the Governor and Council agree to allow
at the Rate of thirty five shillings of Barre, computing
Bar-iron at the Rate of fifty five Pounds of Ton. — and
it is agreed that in case Bar-iron should rise, or fall,
the Price of Barre to be rated accordingly. — Richard
Bond agrees to deliver to the order of the Governor and
Council not less than forty two Barrels of month, completely
fitted as aforesaid, the Governor and Council finding Powder
for proving said Barre. — The Gun - Barre are to be
delivered at the Mouth of the, the Butchere of the said Gun
to be so fitted, that in re-loading them, the jaws shall
not be touched. Witness my Hand this 17th Day of
April Anno Domini 1777. Richard Bond.

Ordered, That the warden shall hereafter
pay to Thomas Courcy, for the use of Thomas Bayly
three hundred, and fifty Pounds, four ten shillings and
three Pence for Am^t of Acc^ts.
