Monday July 7<sup>th</sup> 1777

Present as on Saturday - except M<sup>r</sup> Sm M<sup>r</sup> Sed, M<sup>r</sup> Rogers attended  
Ordered That, the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt. Coward  
twenty pounds on account

That the said Treasurer pay to William Jacob one hundred &  
fifty two pounds, seven shillings and seven pence Curr Amt of Act

Commission of Lieut of Marquis & Reprisal issued to Thomas Steel  
Master of the privateer Schooner called the Beggars Bemison, mounting six  
Carriage Guns, navigated with six Men belonging to William Hammond, Thomas  
Russell, Stacia Stephoun of Baltimore County and James & Joseph Williams  
of Annapolis

Capt. Wright, As the small pox is at Cambridge and you  
are informed some of Colo Richardson's Regiment have it, you are not  
to march your Company to join him till he moves to Salisbury or its  
neighbourhood which we expect will be soon

Commissions issued to Robert Wright app<sup>r</sup> Capt. of a Company  
of Militia of this State embodied under the late Resolution of Congress -

Thomas Clymer app<sup>r</sup> Ensign in same Comp<sup>y</sup>.

James In<sup>r</sup> Skinner Lieut in the Matropes, app<sup>r</sup> second Lieut  
in Adam Groshes Comp<sup>y</sup> of Gumbys Regiment in the room of Edward  
Mayton who hath accepted a Commission in one of the sixteen Regiments

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Michael Joy seventeen  
pounds, Ten shillings Curr due on Act passed

That the said Treasurer pay to John Williams fifteen pounds  
seventeen shillings and five pence due on Act passed

Tuesday July 8<sup>th</sup> 1777
