

Saturday 12th July 1777

Present as on yesterday.

Capt: (David,) you will proceed with the Conqueror to York River Virginia, and thence up the Creek, which leads to Williamsburgh, and call on Messrs Norton & Beall, to whom we wrote by Express a Day or two ago for the Arms and other goods belonging to this State, part of which was at Kemp's Landing, and which we hope will by the time you get there, have been removed to Williamsburgh Capt: Coward is to go with you, he is to take what he can, and you will convoy him, taking the rest. If anything must be left, do not let it be any of the Arms, which we fear are spoiling with the rust. If the goods should not have been removed from Kemp's Landing, get Messrs Norton & Beall's orders, and a Boat or two in James River, and send a trusty Officer or two to bring them to Williamsburgh, to be carted across. If Messrs Norton & Beall should have ordered the goods up here in other Vessels; immediately, you'll proceed back. Show these orders to those Gentlemen, and follow their directions about the goods, they have kindly assisted us in several things.

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt David two hundred Dollars on Acc't.

Monday 20th July 1777

The same Councilors present as on the 12th Inst except W. Polk & W. Lee attended.

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Josiah Polk one hundred and Thirty six pounds two shillings and six pence for attendance in Council.

Commission of Lieu of a Marque & Prize is issued to John Martin a Master of the privateer Schooner called the Swallow mounting four Howitzers and four Swivels & navigated with fifteen men belonging to Hugh Young and others of Baltimore. Comptd dated the 23 July.
