Instead of going directly to the Savannah as mentioned in your Instructions of the 5th proceed to the Shoals and there dispose of your Sargoe and purchase there Bark & Shies if to be had on good Terms, & Salt without going to the Savannah; if you cannot sell to advantage at the Shoals and are ascertained that your Sargoe is admisible at the Savannah, & that you can do better there, proceed to the Savannah as if Tobacco is not admisible at the Savannah & you cannot sell at the Shoals, Store your Tobacco there & go to the Savannah and take the Honour for the Governour's giving you a Credit under the Letter to him which you'll deliver in Case only you go there. — If you sell your Sargoe at the Shoals, carry Bills, if to be had, to the Savannah or if you store your Sargoe continue matters so that there may be a Remittance to pay the Debt you contract at the Savannah

That the said Treasurer pay to Joseph & Andrew two Dutchmen, fifteen Dollars for a Musquet, a broken musquet & three Cullasses

That the said Treasurer pay to Charles Wallaw Esq^r Paym^t of the State Troops, twelve hundred & fifty eight pounds thirteen shillings and eleven pence, Balance of Acc^t passed by the Board of Acc^t

That the said Treasurer pay to Stephen Steward one thousand pounds on Acc^t
