Ordered That the Western Shore Treasurer pay to Captain William Campbell Thirty Pounds, seventeen shillings and six pence due for Clothing to that part of his company formerly Captain Barnes and the further sum of Eighty nine Pounds eighteen shillings and six pence for Rations due his Company as per account passed the Board of Accounts —

John White Ainsworth of the State of Pennsylvania being called upon agreeable to an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland entitled "An Act for the Security of the Government" appeared and was examined but could not produce a certificate of his having taken the Bath prescribed by the State of Pennsylvania and having refused to take the Bath of Fidelity and Support to this State and to the Bath to the United States prescribed by the said Act, the said John White will therefore ordered to enter into a Bond of the Penalty of one thousand Pounds with one sufficient security for his personal Appearance before the Executive Council of the said State of Pennsylvania within Eight Days from the Date hereof and also to return a certificate from the said Executive Council of his having made his personal Appearance before them within eighteen Days from the date hereof which Bond with security he hath given —

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Laypole one hundred and twenty and six pence per account passed the Board —

That the said Treasurer pay to Parket Bark Three pounds, thirteen shillings and six pence on acc't of his last Horse & Co. with Artillery Baggage as per account passed the Board
