Ordered That the Western shore Treasurers pay to Captain William Campbell Thirty Pounds, seventeen shillings and six pence due for Cloathing to that part of his company formerly Captain Laramie and the further Sum of Eighty nine Pounds eighteen shillings and six pence for Rations due his company as per accounts passed the Board of Accounts

John White Sheriff of the State of Pennsylvania being called upon agreeable to an act of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland entitled "an act for the better Security of the Government" appeared and was examined but could not produce a certificate of his having taken the Oath prescribed by the State of Pennsylvania and having refused to take the Oath of Fidelity and Support to this State and also the Oath to the United States prescribed by the said Act, the said John White is therefore ordered to enter into Bond of the Penalty of one thousand Pounds with one sufficient Security for his personal Appearance before the Executive Council of the said State of Pennsylvania within Eight Days from the Date hereof and also to return a certificate from the said Executive Council of his having made his personal appearance before them within eighteen Days from the date hereof which Bond with Security he hath given
