to the General the following Resolves.

By the House of Delegates a March 20. 1778

The House taking into Consideration the Report of the Committee on the
Memorial of Robert Anderson —

Resolved That the Governor and the Council be empowered
to issue on either of the Treasurers for the Sum of nine hundred and twenty
four Pounds six Shillings Common Money, and to pay the same to
the said Robert Anderson on his Order, and that the property of the sails
of the Snow Champion be vested in this State.

That the Governor and the Council be empowered and
requested to sell the said Sails or dispose of and convert them to such
use as may be most advantageous to the State. (By order G. Duwall S. H. D.
which said Resolves was then endorsed; By the Senate March 28. 1778

hundred and seventy one Pounds nine Shillings and eleven Pence due per
account passed by the Committee of Claims.

Robert Wilson of Dorchester County and Samuel Percival of
Anne Arundel County took the Oath of Fidelity and Support to this
State according to the late Act and Certificate given.

That be read Com^o of the Brig^o Baltimore receipt of 2 short 3 pounders
4 long 3 pounders with their Linnings which were sent to Baltimore & also 1 short
3 pounder
