

Wherefore this Board duly impressed with the Importance of the said Service do hereby order that in Case the said Number of one hundred Waggon, and Teams, shall not be made up by Contract by the Time of his Receipt here of that then on his Application to any Justice or Justices of the Peace in Frederick County such Warrants issue for the impressing the number which may be so wanted for the Service aforesaid and that the same be impressed and collected in such manner that the Burthen of the said one hundred Waggon be divided as nearly equal as conveniently may be on the different parts of the said County and further that all the said Waggon and Teams be appraised before they set out on the said Journey and that a List of them with their Values be returned to this Board

Ordered That the Spring Commissary deliver to Capt Daniel Bryan 6 Barrels Beef and 6 ditto of Pork for the Baltimore & Mathopolis to be sent to Lieut William Sudah

That the Commissary of Stores at Baltimore deliver to Col. Gist 94 Shirts & 50 Blankets for the recruits enlisted for the 3^d Regiment

William Hanson & W. Pherson appeared before this Board & qualified as Assistant Clerks to the Auditor General by taking the several Oaths required

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt Baillie of General Oulaskie's Legion four hundred Dollars out of the money remitted by Congress for the recruiting Service on Account

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt. James Peale five hundred Dollars out of the money remitted by Congress for the recruiting Service to be charged to the first Maryland Regiment, per Col. Stone's Order

That the said Treasurer pay to Col. Mord. Gist two thousand Dollars out of the money remitted by Congress for the recruiting Service on Account to be charged to the 3^d Regiment

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt. James Peale five pounds ten Shillings for the use of Daniel Simmons per Act. passed by the Assembly
