Hower, nine Pounds fifteen Shillings and one Penny half penny for the use of George Bare and Eight Pounds for the use of Matthias Buckley as per Act. passed by the Aud Genl

That the said Treasurer pay to Abraham Saw two thousand and ninety four Pounds, nine Shillings as per Act passed by the Aud Genl

That the said Treasurer pay to Abraham Saw seven Pounds seven Shillings and also the further Sum of fifty eight Pounds for the use of Nicholas White per Accounts passed by the Aud. Genl

On the petition of Thomas Masfelm of Kent County who was drafted to serve for nine months agreeable to the late Act. It is ordered that on his procuring an Effective Man to enlist in the Quota of Troops for this State in the Continental Service for three years or during the War discharging this State of the forty Dollar State Bounty and procuring a Certificate from the Lieut of Kent County of his having passed such Recruit that the said Thomas Masfelm be discharged from Service under the said Draft
