

W. Charles Wallace Howard for nine hundred Pounds together with  
her Sails and Rigging

Friday 31 July 1770.

Present as on Yesterday.

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer Pay to William Middleton  
twenty Pounds per aūt passed by the Print. B. to the Aud Gen<sup>l</sup> and also  
Forty Pounds to be delivered over to Capt John Pitt per aūt passed by Al<sup>y</sup>.

That the said Treasurer Pay to Lt. Alexander Anderson Three  
hundred and Thirty nine Pounds, seventeen shillings and seven Pence  
Balance of aūt passed by the Aud Gen<sup>l</sup>.

That the said Treasurer Pay to Joseph Cowman Tr<sup>st</sup> eighty  
two Pounds ten shillings per aūt passed by the Aud Gen<sup>l</sup>.

That the said Treasurer Pay to Nathaniel Potter Esquire  
four hundred and seventy seven Pounds, seventeen shillings and ten  
Pence, four hundred and sixty two Pounds nine shillings and nine  
Pence due himself for the Purchase of Provisions and the further sum  
of four Pounds ten shillings for the use of James Lawrence as per  
aūts passed by the Aud Gen<sup>l</sup>.

That the said Treasurer Pay to Henry Lugh Mafsey m<sup>ty</sup>  
four Pounds, eleven shillings and four Pence for wages due himself and  
crew of the Amelia per aūt. passed by the Aud Gen<sup>l</sup>.

That the said Treasurer Pay to Nathaniel Potter Esq. one  
thousand thirty five Pounds and four Pence to enable him to Pay the  
additional Price on the Provisions Purchased for the Continent in  
Caroline County as regulated by the Governor and Council of which  
aūt to be rendered

Sir, We shall be obliged to you to endeavour to sell the Ship Defence  
for not less than nine thousand Pounds, we would wish to Part from her  
with her Appraisal to<sup>a</sup> agreeable to the Inventory formerly made, but that
