Commissions (dated 15 Augt last, issued to Henry Bateman appointed Capt. John Sears first Lieut, Robert Lusby second Lieut, Robert Davidge Enf. Joseph Warfield second Lieut, John & Harriott Enf of Capt. Phil. Warfields Co Benjamin Trish second Lieut, Zach. Jacobs Enf of Capt. John Boones Co Joshua & Heiken Capt, John Walker first Lieut, and John Shaw second Lieut belonging to the Severn Batt of Milit. in Ann Arundel County

It being represented to this Board by Maj Nath. Smith that the Boom at Baltimore cannot be made serviceable in the Defence of that Town without incurring a considerable Expence in repairing it and that the Iron fiat to it would now sell for a large Sum of Money and that it is the opinion of himself and of many of the Principal Inhabitants of Baltimore Town that it would be prudent and to the Advantage of the public to sell the materials of the said Boom —

This Board concurring in that Opinion request. Majr Smith to sell the Materials of the said Boom, receive the Money and remit the same into the Treasury for the use of the public transmitting an Account thereof to this Board

Ordered that the Commissary of Stores deliver to Majr Nath Smith one hundred pair of Shoes for the use of the Mathuses in Baltimore
