

Commission of a Letter of Marque and Revival issued to Henry Geddes  
Commander of the Sloop Richmond, mounting two long guns, six short  
and six small arms, navigated with 12 Men, 60 Tons burthen belonging  
to Samuel and Robert Purviance of Baltimore

Ordered that the Commissary of Stores deliver to Doct. John  
Tomson Cloth for a great Coat with Trimmings

That the said Commissary of Stores deliver to Capt. Alex<sup>r</sup>  
Turnival 44 Blankets for the use of his Company

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt Alexander  
Turnival one hundred and ninety eight Pounds, eight Shillings and one  
penny due his Company and the further Sum of Twelve Pounds for the  
use of Com<sup>o</sup> Ganettson per Accts passed by the Prin<sup>l</sup> C. to the A<sup>g</sup>.

On the Petition of William West of Dorchester County and the  
Depositions of Solomon West and Charles Carter, lodged therewith, there appearing  
good ground to believe that the Inlistment of the said William West was  
not voluntary but that great violence was used towards him and Measures  
highly unjustifiable were taken to compel him to Inlist. It is therefore  
Ordered by this Board that the said Wm West be not taken or in any manner  
treated as a Soldier or Defter till the Matter be fully heard by this Board or  
the further Order of this Board be obtained
