William Spear, George Amidenberger & Peter Shepherd, Justices of the Peace for Baltimore County certify under their Hands and Seals "that six hundred & two Bushels" and one half Bushel of Indian Corn seized by James Falham Esq<sup>n</sup> Deputy Quarter Master General, in the Hands of Isaac Grist, was adjudged to be seizable under an Act of Assembly of this State and was delivered to the said James Falham Esq<sup>n</sup>

Andrew Buchanan & Edward Rockey Justices of the Peace for Baltimore County certify "that nine Bands of flour the property of Robert Riddle was seized by Robert Buchanan Assistant Commissary of Purchases which has been Judged to be engrossed contrary to Law"

Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February 1779

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Lieut Charles Smith of the 1<sup>st</sup> Maryland Regiment, One hundred and fifty Pounds due him by Resolve of the Assem.

That the said Treasurer pay to John Davidson two hundred and eighty two Pounds for the use of and to be delivered over to Archibald Buchanan being a just and reasonable Allowance to the said A. Buchanan in the Opinion of the Board, for the use of his Ship Yard whilst the Independence and Annapolis were building as well for his own Services in and about superintending the said Vessels under the Agreement made the first Day of Aug<sup>t</sup> 1770 with the then Commissary of Safety.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut Charles Smith 6 pair Shoes and 5 pair Stockings for the first Regiment.
