Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt' Robert Darrell
one thousand one hundred and sixty four Pounds, four Shillings & nine Pence per pay list
and also the further sum of forty one Pounds thirteen Shillings & six Pence per account
raised by the And Gen^r.

That the said Treasurer pay to Com^r Thomas Grayson ninety Pounds the
sum paid by him to the following seamen, Richard Savoy, John Williams, John
James, Richard Foster, Daniel McCar, James Hoggomay forty Dollars each

That the said Treasurer pay to Commodore Grayson four hundred
Pounds to be expended in the Purchase of Plank for the use of the Marine
of this State to be accounted for

That the said Treasurer pay to Charles Wallace Esq^r One thousand five
hundred Pounds on Account.

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Richard a Hancer One
hundred and fifty five Pounds, twelve Shillings & six Pence out of an ^{amount} paid
by the And Gen^r.

The Governor & Council have not been able from the Deficiency of getting
men in the Marine Service to make the Gallies answer their wishes or public
Expectation; the Reason is obvious enough to men of Business in this Country - The situation of the Trade under every exertion necessary and the Governor
and Council are willing to use every Power they have towards protecting it from
the whole of the Convocation with a W^m Smith, W^m Purviance, W^m W^m (Glen)
and Capt' Nicholson the Governor and Council entertain an Opinion that the most
effective force that can be soon put in Motion will be two Gallies with a Tender
and perhaps an armed Vessel of 10 or 12 guns - The Governor and Council cannot
fit out the two Gallies and Tender without 50 Hands (about half of them Sailors)
would better the Service by all the Difference - If the 50 Hands can be
furnished, for three Months by the Gentlemen in Baltimore on private Expence
the Gallies & Tender will be soon ready and shall suffice just within the Capital
