are persuaded a fine going Sloop or Brig of 10 or 12 Guns in Company with the
Gallies would greatly contribute to the Success of the Scheme and to promote as far
as they can the fitting out such a Vessel, they are willing to furnish Fresh Provision
for her for three Months at the Cost of it to be paid for unless as they hope the
General Assembly should agree to make a present of it — It is to be understood that
the fitting out a Sloop or Brig though very much wished is not designed as a
Condition to sending out the Gallies —
