### A Proclamation

That no Escape may be left to those who may riotously break the Peace and disturb  
the order essential to the happiness of the public and the security of Individuals I have thought fit  
with the Advice of the Council, being induced thereto by Complaints of recent Outrages and Threats  
to repeat and extend them to warn all Persons in this State against raising or joining in any riotous  
Assembly or Proceeding as highly illegal and to notify and declare that they will by such unwar-  
-able Conduct subject themselves to the necessary and exemplary Punishments inflicted by the Law  
and all Judges, Justices and Officers of Justice in this State are required according to the Duties  
of their Offices to prevent and suppress all such Riots and to put those who may commit  
them in a due Course of Law. Given at Annapolis this Eleventh Day of May in the  
Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and seventy nine.
