

Tuesday 27 July 1779

Present as on Yesterday

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Gordon Sixty nine Pounds, two shillings and six pence for the Use of Matthias Mepworth also Sixty four Pounds, eleven shillings and three pence and one thousand and forty five Pounds due himself for accounts passed by the Aud^r General.

That the said Treasurer pay to James Galthorn Esq^r one thousand six hundred and ten Pounds, six shillings due him per Act passed by the Aud. Gen^l.

That the said Treasurer pay to Mary Tripolett, two thousand seven hundred and twenty four Pounds, seven shillings and six Pence due for Damages of her House &c per Account allowed by the House of Delegates and passed by the Aud. Gen^l.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Anthony Smith a Soldier in the 1st Regiment 1 Shirt and Check stuff for a pair of Overalls

That the said Commissary deliver to Elisha W Daniel a q^r M^r Sold^r in the 7th Reg^t Discharged twenty four Pounds, ten shillings in Cloathing and also William Brigg a q^r M^r Sold^r in the 7th Reg^t Discharged, twenty eight Pounds, ten shillings in Cloathing due them by the Act of Assembly to procure Troops for the American Army

That the said Commissary deliver to Sgt John Vany (Junior from Ct Stone) of the 1st Reg^t 4 pair Shoes, 2 Coats 1 pair Overalls, 2 Hats and 1 pair Leather Breeches

Ordered that the Lieutenant of Dorchester County send forward to Chester Town in Kent County under a proper Guard of the Militia of Dorchester County the British Prisoners of War sent by the Lieutenant of Somerset County to Cambridge and that the said prisoners be delivered at Chester Town to the Lieut of Kent County who is to send them under a sufficient Guard of the Militia of his County to Wilmington where they are to be delivered to the Principal Officer of the Delaware State residing there in order that they may be sent from thence to Philadelphia with this Order that they may be there imprisoned till Exchanged. The Continental Army Commissaries are desired to furnish the Guards and Prisoners with Provisions for their Subsistence this being properly a Continental Charge and no other Provision being established at least on this Route.

That the said Commissary of Stores deliver to Danl Proctor a q^r M^r Sold^r in the 8th Reg^t Discharged Twenty eight Pounds, ten shillings in Cloathing, David Welch a q^r M^r Sold^r in the 6th Reg^t Discharged, sixteen Pounds, thirteen shillings and six Pence in Cloathing, William Greenwood a q^r M^r Sold^r in the 5th Reg^t Discharged, Twenty seven Pounds, ten shillings in Cloathing, Michael Imprey a q^r M^r Sold^r in the 5th Reg^t Discharged Twenty eight Pounds, ten shillings in Cloathing & Charles Diamond a q^r M^r Sold^r in the 5th Reg^t Disch^d Twenty eight Pounds ten shillings in Cloathing due them by the Act of Ass^y to procure Troops for the American Army
