

the said Brigantine clearing out at the proper Office and the Captains previously thereto, delivering into such Office a Manifest of her Lading and together with two others of the Principal Officers of the said Brig making Oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God that such a Manifest contains a true Account, of the Lading of the said Brigantine and that no other Provisions have been to their Knowledge or Belief or shall be with their private and Consent Laden or put onboard such Brigantine other than such as are for the Subsistence of her Crew and have been or shall be allowed and permitted by the Naval Officer and that they will use their utmost Endeavours to deliver the whole Cargo of Provisions aforesaid to the proper Person or Persons to receive the same for the Use of the Fleet and Army of his most Christian Majesty; and the Agent Employed in directing the Lading of the said Brigantine also making Oath that the Provisions mentioned in the said Manifest are Stuffed and Designed to be transported in the said Brigantine for the Use of the Navy and Army of his most Christian Majesty and for no other Purpose to the best of his Knowledge and Belief and also the Like Permission granted to the Brigantine The Lady De Meralles to Lade as aforesaid

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt. Daniel Bryan One hundred and thirty seven Pounds thirteen Shillings and three Pence due himself and also the further sum of Eighty four Pounds, Eleven Shillings due the Crew of the Dolphin of War passed by the Act.

That the said Treasurer pay to Elizabeth a Slave fifteen Pounds due here as aforesaid passed by the Act General

Daniel Bryan first Lieutenant of the Galley Independence Resigns his Commission which is accepted of

Thursday 23 September 1779

Present as on Tuesday

Ordered that the Commissary of Stores deliver to Thomas Goe late a Sergeant in the 5 Maryland Regiment Discharged the amount of Twenty nine Pounds, ten Shillings in Clothing due him by an Act of Assembly to procure Troops for the A. Army

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Richard Bryan thirty five Pounds due him for an Act passed by the Act Genl

That the said Treasurer pay to John a Slave, twelve thousand Pounds to be delivered over to Capt. Geo. Keppel of Baltimore for the Purchase of Ammunition and Clothing for the Army on Account.

Friday 24 September 1779

Present as on Yesterday

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Sands Forty Pounds and five Shillings due him of an Act passed by the Depty Adm.

That the said Treasurer pay to Rich. Pindell Surgeon to the 6th Regt of Cont. Troops two thousand Dollars in law of the Articles for the present Year allowed by the late Act of Assembly
