That the Commissary of Stores deliver to James Pope a blind soldier of the third Regiment one Coat, one Waistcoat, one Shirt and one pair of Stockings

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Thomas Johnson junior Five Hundred and Ninety eight pounds on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to Richard Dallam Esq^r Commissary of Purchases for Stafford County Ten thousand pounds on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to Daniel Monroe Esq^r Five Hundred and Sixty Three pounds, Ten Shillings and him per Account passed by the Aid Gen^l. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Daniel of St. Thomas Lemser Esquire one thousand Five Hundred pounds on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to Col^o Peter Adams, ten thousand five hundred and Fifty Dollars to be charged to the United States agreeable to an Order on this State from a Major General Gates. —

That the said Treasurer pay to James Maunobin Eight pounds, Six Shillings and eight pence of the new Emission in lieu of three hundred and thirty three pounds Six Shillings and eight pence due him per Account passed by the Aid Gen^l.

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt William Campbell one hundred and twenty seven pounds ten Shillings of the same Emission for one hundred and sixty Gun Locks sold this Board at Seven Shillings & Six pence

The order on the western Shore Treasurer in favor of Richard Dallam for Ten thousand pounds of the 15th of May this Day returned. —

Ordered That the Commissary of Stores deliver to James Pope a blind soldier of the 3^d Regiment one pair of Breeches and one pair of Shoes, and also to Nicholas McNamee a maimed Soldier of the 1st Regim^t one Shirt, one pair of Breeches one pair of Stockings and one pair of Shoes. —

An Agreement entered into this eleventh Day of December 1780. Between the Governor and Council of the one part and William Campbell of Annapolis of the other Witnesseth that the said William Campbell agrees to stock in a good sufficient and workmanlike manner all the Musket Barrels, now belonging to the State in the Care of John Shaw and to deliver the whole of them to the Order of the Governor and Council on or before the first Day of May next and not less than fifty at any one time of Delivery and that he will procure mounting and Ramrods for the said Muskets upon the most reasonable terms In consideration whereof the Governor and Council agrees to pay to the said William Campbell Seventeen Shillings and six pence in gold and Silver or Current Money at the common Exchange at the Time of Payment for every Musket stocked, finished and Delivered in Manner aforesaid and to advance the said William Campbell all Sums of Money which he may engage to pay for mounting and Ramrods. —
