Ordered That the western shew Treasurer pay to Capt Alexander Trueman eight Pounds, eight Shillings and nine pence of the new Emision in lieu of three hundred and thirty seven Pounds, ten Shillings and five pence, three Shillings and one penny half penny of the said Emision in lieu of Two hundred and five pounds, two Shillings due him per Account passed by the Aid Genl. —

That the said Treasurer pay to John Bullen Esq<sup>r</sup> Fifty Pounds Specie for a Horse purchased of him by the Governor and Comd for Mr Green to go to Philadelphia for the plates for the Emision of money. —

That the said Treasurer pay to George Muddock Twenty Pounds Specie to be expended in procuring necessaries for the Convention Troops in Fred Town on acc<sup>t</sup>.

That the said Treasurer pay to Captain Joseph Smith of Col. Nathl Gists Regiment, seven pounds, nineteen Shillings and nine pence of the new Emision in lieu of three hundred and nineteen pounds, ten Shillings part passed by the Aid Genl. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Col<sup>o</sup> Peter Adams Twenty one Pounds fourteen Shillings and two pence half penny of the same Emision in lieu of Eight hundred and fifty eight pounds, eight Shillings and four pence due him per Account passed by the Aids. General. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Alexander Trueman thirty Pounds of the same Emision on Account agreeably to the Resolution of the Genl Ass<sup>y</sup> of this date.

That the Young Commissary deliver to the said Capt Alexander Trueman Seventeen and a half gallons of Rum and forty eight pounds of Sugar due him to this Inst. and also to Capt Joseph Smith Twelve Gallons of Rum and forty eight pounds of Sugar due him to the 31<sup>st</sup> Instant.

That the Armorer deliver to Col<sup>o</sup> Peter Adams one pound of powder and five pounds lead on Account. —

That Mess<sup>rs</sup> Vanswearingen and Thomas Beatty Commissioners for Frederick County deliver to George Muddock all the publick Gun in their hands. —

That Col<sup>o</sup> Thomas Price Commissary of Frederick County deliver to the said George Muddock, as much Beef, Pork, flour, Bran & Shorts as he may have occasion for in supplying the Convention Troops. —

That Christopher Edelm Esquire Collector of the Tax for Frederick County pay to the said George Muddock for the use of the Convention Troops and their Guard fifteen thousand Pounds to be by him accounted for. —
