rendered it impracticable for him to account in the usual and accustomed Manner; for
the Money deposited with him by the State to be expended in the Recruiting service;
are of Opinion that the Auditor may settle General Gists Account on his Oath, the
General having first satisfied him by his own Oath or the Testimony of a credible
Witness, that his Books and papers did fall into the Enemy's Hands. —
