

Ordered that the master where Treasurer pay to James Collins three thousand five hundred and five pounds, ten shillings for two Boats for the Dolphin and Plate State Books bought of him by this Board. —

That the said Treasurer pay to James O'Hara a blind soldier seventy five pounds allowed him by this Board in virtue of a Resolution of the Genl Assembly of the 7<sup>th</sup> of August 1779 up to this Day. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Forrest ten pounds of the new Edition to be delivered over to John McCay a soldier in the 5<sup>th</sup> Regt to enable him to get his Leg cured. —

That the following Commissary deliver to Capt William Brown and Lieut John Carson each fourteen gallons of Rum and forty eight pounds of Sugar and to Capt Lieut James Smith thirteen and a half Gallons of Rum and forty eight pounds of Sugar and also to Capt Richard Dorsey eighteen Gallons of Rum and fifty one pounds of Sugar deficiency of Stores due them for 1780.

That Col. Jenifer receive ten Bushels of the public Salt in the Hands of Henry Rogers Esquire which this Board have the appropriation of.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to James O'Hara one vest, one pair of breeches, one pair of stockings, one pair of Shoe gone Shirt.

That the Armourer deliver to Capt William Middleton one six pound Cannon, wheels and carriage, one hundred Stand of Arms, one thousand flints, one Barrel of Cannon and one Hg of Market powder, one hundred 6<sup>lb</sup> round shot and twenty four pounds 6<sup>lb</sup> Grado Shot to be delivered over to the Lieut of Dorchester County, and one hundred Cartridge Boxes and one thousand flints to be delivered over to the Lieut of Worcester County for the use of the Militia of the said Counties —

Pardon granted to John Parsons of Washington County convicted at Washington County August Court 1780, for Horse stealing, on condition that he forthwith join the Regiment to which he belongs and do not desert there from during the present war, and further that he do not return to the said County of Washington during the term aforesaid. —

George Jackson of Kent County appeared before this Board in pursuance of a Warrant directed to the Lieut<sup>t</sup> of Kent County to apprehend him, and upon the examination of himself and his papers there does not appear any good Ground to believe that he is a disaffected and dangerous person and that his going at large will be dangerous to this State, nor that he has purchased any Gun with intent to be carried to the Enemy. Ordered therefore that he be discharged. —

George Tansant Mann being apprehended by the Lieutenant of Kent County, and this Day brought before this Board in virtue of a Warrant issued the nineteenth of January ultimo, is adjudged a disaffected and dangerous person & there being good reason to believe his going at Large is dangerous to the State. Ordered therefore that the said George T. Mann be committed to the public prison of Baltimore County in virtue of under authority of the Resolution of the Genl Assembly of the 19<sup>th</sup> January aforesaid and there to remain until this Board take further Order therem. —
