Ordered That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Serj<sup>t</sup> Benjamin Fitzgourd of the 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment a Compleat Suit of Cloaths, John Cannon of the 2<sup>d</sup> Regiment, one pair of Overalls and one Jacket, Francis Burton of the 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment, one shirt and one hat, William Draughton of the 6<sup>th</sup> one Coat, vest, pair of Overalls and Blanket, one shirt and one pair of shoes, Henry Livingston and George Field of the 3<sup>d</sup> Reg<sup>t</sup> each, one Coat one vest one pair of Overalls, one Blanket and one shirt, Serj<sup>t</sup> William Morgan of the Maryland Artillery one Blanket and also to Col<sup>l</sup> Adams, Lewis for two shirts in part of the articles allowed him by the General Assembly for the year 1701.

That the Young Commissary send fifteen bushels of Salt to John Smith Brookes Upper Marlborough. —

That Christopher Edelm Esquire Collector of the Tax for Frederick County pay to George Muddock Esquire Commissary for supplying the Convention Troop Thirty thousand pounds on account.

That the western shore Treasurer deliver to Col<sup>l</sup> Mich<sup>l</sup> Forrest one hundred and fifty W<sup>ts</sup> of Tobacco on account.

Commissions issued to Philip Thomas appointed Captain and John Ross Key Lieut of a Troop of Horse in Frederick County raised in virtue of an Act to encourage the raising a volunteer Troop of light Horse in Baltimore Town and each County of this State. —

Stephen West Esquire elected a Member of the Council to the Governor appeared & Qualified by taking the Jurat Oaths required by the Form of Government and Laws of this State, Certificate thereof being produced he took his Seat.

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Zachariah Duvall three pounds eighteen Shillings and nine pence of the new Emission in lieu of one hundred and fifty seven pounds, ten Shillings and four pence per Act passed by the D<sup>g</sup> and.

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt William Brown twenty pounds six Shillings and three pence of the same Emission in lieu of eight hundred and twelve pounds, ten Shillings and himself, nineteen pounds, eighteen Shillings and one penny half penny of the same Emission in lieu of seven hundred and ninety six pounds, five Shillings for the use of Lieut John Cannon, and eighteen pounds, five Shillings and seven pence half penny of the same Emission in lieu of seven hundred and thirty one pounds, five Shillings for the use of Capt James Smith per Act<sup>l</sup> passed by the D<sup>g</sup> and.

That John Crisall send fifteen bushels of salt to John Smith Brookes at Upper Marlboro. —

That the said John Crisall Young Commissary deliver to Lieut John Chivers of the Maryland Artillery, two Gallons of Rum and eight pounds of Sugar and him for the Month of January. —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Benjamin Maish and Philip Sarry of the 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment, each, a suit of Cloaths and one Blanket, Dennis Trummell one pair of Breeches, one shirt & one pair of shoes, Thomas Clements one pair of Breeches, one shirt, one pair of shoes & one pair of Stockings, William Clements one pair of shoes and one shirt, of the Reg<sup>t</sup> Chas and to Ignatius Mitchell who of the 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment one pair of breeches, one pair of shoes, one pair Stockings & one shirt.
