

John Fowler appointed Chaplains to the Governor and Council in the room of Robert Reith deceased. —

Wednesday 7th February 1781.

Ordered that John Bullen Esq. Quarter Master furnish C H Hodgkin with two or more Waggon, Carts and Drives immediately to remove the public Records. That the Issuing Commissary deliver to Doct. Murray fourteen pounds salt powder to be accounted for —

that the western shore treasure pay to John Dorsey Esq. two hundred and forty eight pounds, six shillings and six pence of the new Emission on Account.

That John Bullen Esq. Quarter Master deliver to Luit Luckett a public Horse. —

Thursday 8th February 1781. —

Ordered That the Issuing Commissary deliver to Capt Nathaniel Shepherd employed in removing the Cargois of the Antilles and Cato to Baltimore one gallon of Rum. — Capt Samuel McPherson of the 1st Regt. nineteen and a half gallons of Rum and forty eight pounds of Sugar — Capt William Bruce of the same Regt. eighteen gallons of Rum and forty eight pounds of sugar and also to Ensign Henry Clements of the 3^d Regt. five gallons of Rum and twenty four pounds of Sugar due them for the year 1780. —

That the western shore treasure pay to Ensign Robert Halkerton of the 3^d Regt. and Ensign Henry Clements of the same Regt. each, Thirty pounds of the new Emission agreeable to a Resolution of the Genl. Assembly of the 30th Dec. last and also to the said Ensign Henry Clements five pounds nineteen shillings and three pence of the same Emission instead of two hundred and seventy eight pounds twelve shillings and six pence due him per Act. passed by the D. and C. —

That the said Treasurer pay to His Excellency Thomas Pin Lee Esq. Three hundred and twelve pounds, ten shillings of the same Emission on Account. —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Capt. William Bruce of the First Regt. Cloth and Pennings sufficient for a suit of Cloaths and Linen for two Quirts in part of the Articles for the present year and one and a quarter yards of Shalloon deficiency of 1780. —

In virtue of the "Act to regulate Auctions" Thomas Gates is appointed Auctioneer for Baltimore County. — William Wise for Worcester County and John Denwood for Somerset County. —

Friday 9th February 1781.

Ordered That the Commissary of Stores deliver to William Morgan late a Soldier in the 7th Regt. one suit of Cloaths, one Shirt, one pair of Shoes and one pair of Stockings on Account. —

That the western shore treasure pay to James Portisfield two hundred thousand pounds of Tobacco including four pence for each to be paid over to James Clay Esq. Paymaster of the Southern Army instead of three hundred and twenty thousand Dollars for his order in favor of Peter & Hallett Esqrs. in virtue of a Resolution of Congress of some last
