That the said Treasurer pay to Robert Roberts eighteen shillings and nine pence of the same Emission in lieu of thirty seven pounds, ten shillings five pence not paid by the D<sup>r</sup> Adm<sup>r</sup>. —

That the Young Commissary deliver to Charles Wheeler and John Lane taken prisoners by the enemy Tom Day's provisions. —

Philip Thomas Esquire appointed Lieutenant of Frederick County & Hills in the room of Baker Johnson resigned. —

Philip Meroney appointed and commissioned Compt of Capt Thomas Troop of light Horse in Frederick County raised in virtue of an Act to encourage the raising a Volunteer Troop of light Horse in Baltimore Town & each County of this State. —

Whereas it appears to this Board from a Warrant issued by Philip Thomas Esquire one of the Justices of the Peace for Frederick County upon the Bath of Peter that Thomas Hall resident of Virginia hath travelled into this State without a pass and that he brought and delivered sealed Letters from British prisoners at the Banks in Virginia to British Prisoners in Frederick County aforesaid. Wherefore It is the Opinion of this Board that the said Thomas Hall going at Large is dangerous to the State. You are therefore hereby empowered required and directed to arrest the said Thomas Hall without Delay and have him before us together with his papers forthwith that he may be dealt with according to Law and for you so doing this shall be your sufficient Warrant — Given in Council this 19 February 1701.

That the Young Commissary deliver to Elizabeth Buckley a Goldens wife of the 2<sup>d</sup> Regt rations during her husband's Sickness. —

That the western Shore Treasurer pay to William Hyde Five thousand two hundred and thirty four pounds due him for his last years Depreciation per Account paid by the D<sup>r</sup> Adm<sup>r</sup> Genl. —
