pounds ten shillings and also twenty eight pounds, two shillings and six pence  
of the same Empson in part of his last years Salary as a counsellor on Ad<sup>t</sup>.

that the said Treasurer pay to Capt Hutchinson & McAllister fifty  
six pounds, eighteen shillings and three pence of the same Empson value of Two  
hundred and seventy two pounds, ten shillings due him per Act passed by the Ad<sup>t</sup>.

that the said Treasurer pay to Lieut Nicholas Ruketts of  
the Artillery twelve pounds, one shilling and two pence of the same Empson in  
value of six hundred and forty two pounds, seven shillings and six pence due  
him per Account passed by the Aud<sup>d</sup> Gnd<sup>d</sup> —

that the said Treasurer pay to Maj John Eccleston of the  
5<sup>th</sup> Regt late a prisoner in New York fifty pounds of the same Empson  
agreeable to a Resolution of the Gen<sup>d</sup> Assembly passed last Session —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Edward Hemmey a  
Recoat for the Artillery, one Coat, one Jacket, one Shirt, one pair of Stockings  
one pair of Shoes, one Hat and one Blanket, — One Coat of the 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment  
one pair of Breeches, one Shirt and one pair of Shoes, — Edward Armstrong a Drum<sup>r</sup>  
of the 2<sup>d</sup> Regt, one pair of overall, one pair of shoes and one Shirt and also to  
Major John Eccleston Cloth and Trimmings for a suit of Cloaths and Linen  
for Four Shirts due him for the year 1780. —

That the Young Commissary deliver to Lieut Nicholas Ruketts  
twenty Gallons of Rum and fifty one pounds of Sugar due him to the 1<sup>st</sup> Inst. —

In virtue of the Act of the General Assembly "for the emitting  
Bills of Credit to the value of five thousand four hundred pounds Sterling for the con-  
venience of change and issuing them in exchange for the Bills of equal value now in  
circulation" passed October Session 1780. William Wilkins and Isaac Ward are appoint-  
ed Supervisors of the press for Superintending the printing of the said Bills and  
Frederick Green, Thomas Johnson jun<sup>r</sup>, John Callahan and Nicholas Harwood  
Signers thereof —

Wednesday 28 February 1781.

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to John Martin  
two pounds, eleven shillings and eleven pence of the new Empson value of one  
hundred and six pounds, seventeen shillings and six pence due him per Account  
passed by the Ad<sup>t</sup> Aud<sup>d</sup> —

that the said Treasurer pay to Elijah Robeson Seven pounds  
ten shillings of the same Empson value of three hundred Pounds due him per  
Account passed by the Aud<sup>d</sup> Gnd<sup>d</sup> —

That the Commissary deliver to Lieutenant John Quever thirty  
five rounds of Market cartridges & six rounds for four pences —
