Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Major John Eccleston
of the 3rd Regiment, nineteen pounds, four shillings, and nine pence of the new Empirion
value of seven hundred and fifty nine pounds, ten shillings due him for stores per Acc't
paid by the d^rd Auditor. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Lieut Thomas Rouse of the 2nd Regiment
nineteen pounds, four shillings and nine pence of the same Empirion value of seven
hundred and fifty nine pounds ten shillings due him for stores per Acc't paid by
the D^ry Aud^r and also the further sum of fifty pounds of the same Empirion a-
greeable to a Resolution of the General Assembly of the 5th Jan^r last on Account

That the Young Commissary deliver to Major John Eccleston and
Lieut Thomas Rouse each twenty four Gallon of Rum and Ninety six pounds of
Sugar due them for the last year. and also to Thomas Fitzpatrick, and Garret & Murphy
lately deserted from the British rations until one of the State Boats returns. —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut Thomas Rouse, both
and Trimmings for a suit of Cloaths and Linen for four Shirts due him for the
year 1700. and also to John Morrison a Drummer of the 1st Regiment one Hat, one
pair Gloves, one Vest, two Shirts, two pair Stockings, one pair Shoes, one Blanket
and one Knapsack due him for the present year. —

Warrant issued, directed to Donaldson Gates Engineer D^ry Collector Gen^r.
to improve what Carriges, Teams and Drawers may be necessary for removing the
Cannon Hous, Baggage &c belonging to the Detachment under the command of
the Marquis De la Fayette aro^r from Christians to the Head of Elk and
also all Tafels, Hand^s &c that are at Elk or else where which may be necessary.

Warrant issued, directed to John Bullen Engine to improve all the Tafels
with their hand^s &c in the River Severn, to proceed with all possible Dispatch to the
Head of Elk to receive the Marquis De la Fayette Detachment with their Baggages
and also to James Lathorn Engine to improve all the Tafels in Baltimore for
the purpose aforesaid. —

On the application of John Dorsey &c. to carry Provisions to Virginia
there, to be delivered to the use of the French or American Troop, Permission will
be granted on giving Bond and Security as may be required. —

Ordered that the Young Commissary furnish all the water Carts he can
procure or so many as may be necessary to supply the Tafels imported in this Harbor
for the purpose of transporting Troope. —

pounds, one shilling and ten pence half penny, of the same Empirion due him per
Acc't paid by the d^rd Auditor. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Adam Rible nineteen pounds, thirteen shillings &
one pence of the same Empirion due him per Acc't paid by the d^rd Auditor. —

That the said Treasurer pay to John King twenty eight pounds six shillings
of the same Empirion due him per Acc't paid by the d^rd Auditor. —
