

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Major John Euleston of the 5th Regiment nineteen pounds, four shillings and nine pence of the new Emission value of seven hundred and sixty nine pounds, ten shillings due him for stores per Account passed by the Auditors. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Lieut Thomas Rouse of the 2^d Regiment nineteen pounds, four shillings and nine pence of the same Emission value of seven hundred and sixty nine pounds ten shillings due him for stores per Aud. passed by the Depty Aud. and also the further sum of fifty pounds of the same Emission accountable to a Resolution of the General Assembly of the 5th Jan^y last on Account.

That the Spring Commissary deliver to Major John Euleston and Lieut Thomas Rouse, each twenty four Gallons of Rum and ninety six pounds of Sugar due them for the last year, and also to Thomas Fitzgenald, and Gerard Murphy lately departed from the British rations until one of the State Boats returns. —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut Thomas Rouse, Cloth and Trimmings for a suit of floath and Linnen for four Shirts due him for the year 1700. and also to John Morrison a Drummer of the 1st Regiment one Hat, one pair Breeches, one Vest, two Shirts, two pair Stockings, one pair Shoes, one Blanket and one Knapsack due him for the present year. —

Warrant issued, directed to Donaldson Gator Esquire Depty Tellaster Genl to impress what Carriages, Teams and Drivers may be necessary for removing the Cannon, Stores, Baggage &c. belonging to the Detachment under the Command of the Marquis De la Fayette from Christiansburg to the Head of Elk and also all vessels, hands &c. that are at Elk or else where which may be necessary.

Warrants issued, directed to John Bullen Esquire to impress all the vessels with their hands &c. in the River Severn, to proceed with all possible Dispatch to the Head of Elk to receive the Marquis De la Fayette Detachment with their Baggage and also to James Lathorn Esquire to impress all the vessels in Baltimore for the purpose aforesaid. —

On the application of John Dorsey & Co. to carry Provisions to Virginia there to be delivered to the use of the French or American Troops, Permission will be granted on giving Bond and Security as may be required. —

Ordered that the Spring Commissary furnish all the water Larks he can procure or so many as may be necessary to supply the vessels impressed in this Harbour for the purpose of transporting Troops. —

That the said Treasurer pay to John King twenty eight pounds six shillings of the same Emission due him per Account passed by the Aud. Genl. —
