(Tuesday 6. March 1701 -

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Thomas Beatty five pounds, twelve shillings and six pence of the new Emision of Acl paid by the D^r and a That the said Treasurer pay to Doct: James Murray two hundred pounds of the same Emision on Account. -

An Agreement made this fifth day of March one thousand seven hundred and eighty one Between the Governor and Council in Behalf of the State of Maryland and Stephen Steward and Company. -

That the said Stephen Steward and Company have this Day chartered to the Governor and Council in behalf of the State of Maryland the Sloop Porpoise Captain William Heems, to carry a load of flour from the Port of Baltimore to the City of Havana for the freight of one half of the Cargo of Flour laden onboard the said Sloop Porpoise and the said Stephen Steward and Company agree to take onboard the said Sloop the load of Flour free of all charges (any duty hereafter to be imposed on the export of Flour excepted) and pay all port charges at the Port of Delivery and to take onboard such Goods or Merchandise from the wharves or Landing places at the City of Havana aforesaid as shall be ordered by the Governor and Council to fill one half of the said Sloop which Goods are to be delivered in the State of Maryland free of Freight or other charges (the Duty on Imports excepted) and the Governor and Council agree to give the said Stephen Steward and Company five per cent Commission on the cost of the Cargo of the said Sloop for purchasing the same, the amount of which Cargo shall be paid by the Governor and Council on behalf of the State of Maryland as soon as may be convenient and the said Stephen Steward &c^r agree and engage to have the said Sloop well found manned and armed for such voyage and make the said Sloop during the said voyage shall take any prize the Stew^r shall be entitled to one third of any Prize money received by the Owners of the said Sloop. — James Bric^r Pres^r of the Council

This Board having agreed with the Owners of the Porpoise to charter her on the Terms hereunto agreed on to carry a Load of Flour to the Havana We hereby Permit and request the Naval Officer of the Fourth District to clear her out on condition that she be subject to the orders of this Board as to the time of her sailing. —

Ordered that the eastern shore Treasurer pay to Clement Holliday thirty three pounds of the new Emision on Account. —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to James Dowe of the 5 Regt. Ies^r Power of the extra Regt^r each, one Shirt — and also to Captain William Wilmot of the 3^d Regiment and Lieut Robert Wilmot of the Artillery each, London for two Shirts due them for the Year 1700

That the Armour deliver to Sergeant Sticholson thirty five pounds of a Musket cartridges & nine muskets. —

Ordered that the Ierung Commissary deliver to Enf. John Boone 1st Regt. four Gallons of Rum & fifteen pounds of Sugar due to Derby inclusive —
