

Ordered that the western Show Treasurer pay to John Chalmers two thousand Pounds to be expended in purchasing Provisions of the Marquis de La Fayette and to be by him accounted for. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Enr. John Boone of the 1st Regt. four pounds, fifteen shillings and two pence of the new Emision due him per Account paid by the Depy And. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Hubb Fowler Twenty five pounds and ten pence of the same Emision on Account of his Salary to 6th Inst.

The Commissioners of Purchases for the Eastern Show except East County, and also the Commissioners of Frederick, Washington and Prince Georges Counties are authorized and requested to seize or cause to be seized such Quantities of Fresh and Salt provisions as are Specified in a Letter from this Board to the said Commissioners, of the 7th Inst. for the use of the Detachment under the Command of the Marquis La Fayette and also to impress a sufficient number of Horses with their Hounds &c, Wagons or other Carriages with their Teams and Drivers to Transport what Provisions they may obtain as aforesaid to such place as shall hereafter be directed. —

Ordered That the Commissary of Stores deliver to William Taylor of the 1st Regt. one Suit of Cloaths, a Cloak & Philson of the 7th Regt. one Shirt

That the said Treasurer pay to Enr. Robert Halkerton of the 3rd Regt. Fifteen pounds, and Seven pence half penny of the new Emision due him for Stores per Account paid by the Depy And. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Ensign Clark McPherson of the 1st Regt. nine pounds, twelve shillings and four pence half penny of the same Emision due him per Account paid by the 3rd And. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Enr. Henry Clements of the 3rd Regt. Three pounds four shillings and one penny half penny of the same Emision due him per Account paid by the Depy And. —

That the Young Commissary deliver to Enr. Robert Halkerton twenty Gallons of Rum and eighty pounds of sugar due him to the 26 Feby. Ensign Clark McPherson twelve Gallons of Rum and forty eight pounds of sugar and also to Enr. Henry Clements four Gallons of Rum and fifteen pounds of sugar due them to the 1st instant. —

Permission is hereby granted to lade onboard the Schooner Salley of the Burthen of twelve Tons or thereabouts belonging to Samuel Hayward & William Allen a cargo of Flour, Bread, Beef, Hogs, Sheep, Poultry, Brandy, Wine & Vegetables and the same to clear out and transport inter to and for the use of the Fleet of his most Christian Majesty in the Chesapeake and the American Army in Virginia the Captain of the said Schooner previous to his Loading onboard any of the said Articles, giving Bond payable to the State in the penalty of one thousand Pounds Specie —

Conditioned that if the said cargo shall be delivered onboard the Fleet of his most Christian Majesty or to the American Army in Virginia the Damage of the Sea and Enemy only excepted and shall within four months of the date of such Bond produce to the Governor and Council of this State a certificate under the hand
