Commission issued to Samuel Mathews appointed Capt in the room of Thomas Mathews Robert Pam Davis first Lieut Robert Smith second Lieut and Marion Rawlings Ensign of the West River Battalion of Militia in the County of Frederick —

Monday 19th March 1781. —

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Capt Benjamin Price to be delivered over to Ensign Roger Nelson of the 6th Regt twelve pounds ten shillings and nine pence of the new Emision due him per bill passed by the D. And.

That the said Treasurer pay to the said Capt Benjamin Price of the 2^d Regt five pounds, eight shillings and three pence of the same Emision due him for Stores per Account passed by the D. And. —

That the said Treasurer pay to William Whetstone eighteen pounds, fifteen shillings of the same Emision due him per bill passed by the D. And.

That the aforesaid Commissary deliver to Capt Benjamin Price eight Gallons of Rum and thirty two pounds of Sugar due him to his account —

That Andrew Buchanan Capt Lieut of Baltimore County pay to Capt George Keeney ten thousand pounds out of the money received by him for Militia Times and from Clashes to be by him accounted for. —

That Capt George Keeney deliver to Brigadier Genl Gist Ammunition for the use of the Fort and Arms and Ammunition for the Regular Troops in Baltimore Town. —

Tuesday 20th March 1781.

Ordered That the aforesaid Commissary deliver to Capt Charles Daybell of the Schooner Paragon five Gallons of Rum on account. —

That the western Shore Treasurer pay to David Poe Esqurer one hundred Pounds of the new Emision on account. —

That the said Treasurer pay to William Brown four pounds five shillings and ten pence half penny of the same Emision due him per bill passed.

That the said Treasurer pay to Ignatius Wheeler two hundred and eighty two pounds, one shilling and seven pence of the same Emision due him per Account passed by the said Genl. —

That the said Treasurer pay to John Hallet of the 7th Regt ten shillings of the same Emision value of Twenty pounds the gratif allowed him by the Genl Assembly 1780. —

Capt Montjoy Bayley is appointed to receive and provide for such Recruits as may be raised in Frederick County. —

Wednesday 21 March 1781.

Ordered That the Ammunition deliver to John Davidson forty seven three pound shot and also to Robert Atkinson thirty flints & three hundred cartridges to be delivered over to Joseph Averikin who is to be accountable for the same. —
