of Arms No: 6 & 7 containing fiftysix stand of Arms one lbs No: 12 containing  
fifty nine cartridges Boxes and Bayonet Belts, also fiftysix hundred Market  
cartridges and one hundred and twenty Flints to be delivered over to Col: John  
Weems for the use of the Militia of Ann Crimel County. —

Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1701.

Ordered that the armourer deliver to Robert Smith Esq: Forty

Maddleton of the Plates two hundred Market cartridges. —

That James Calloway Esq: Two hundred and eighteen Bushels of  
Unmarketable Flour for so much seized from him as agent for the Marine  
of France viz in the hands of John Smith Esq: three hundred & twenty nine bushels George and  
Thirty four Pounds Chambers eighty & the produce of two hundred & six bushels of wheat  
in 10 days amounting to fifteen bushels
