Sixty three Coats, Sixty three Vests, Sixty three pair Breeches, one hundred and ninety shirts and forty Blankets to be accountable to the Commissary. and also to John Hobson of the 5<sup>th</sup> Regmt a suit of Cloaths and two Shirts. -

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Ensign Levasche fifty pounds of the new Emission agreeable to a Resolution of the General Assembly. -

That the said Treasurer pay to John Maccubbin Twenty seven pounds ten Shillings of the same Emission due him per Acct. paid by the Aud. G<sup>l</sup>. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Ensign Levasche Twenty four pounds and eleven pence of the same Emission due him for Store paid by the Aud. G<sup>l</sup>. -

That the Young Commissary deliver to Ensign Levasche Thirty Gallons of Rum and one hundred and twenty pounds of Sugar due to April next. -

Leave given to Ann Tilley, Widow, to go with a Flag, on board the British Ships lying in the Road off this City to endeavor to obtain of the commanding Officers, a Negro Woman and three Children her property taken away by a Mutinous Man the Husband of the Woman. -

Ordered that the Commissary of Stores deliver to Benjamin Smith of the Cata Regmt one pair of shoes and one Shirt. -

That the Armourer deliver to Col<sup>l</sup> Elijah Robinson five pounds of powder and twenty pounds of Shot or lead for the use of the militia of Ann Arundel County and to be accounted for. -

That Capt Philomon Warfield deliver to Capt Deale two Chests of Arms No. 7 containing fifty Stand of Arms one Chest No. 2 containing fifty nine Cartridges Bages and Bayonet Bolts, also six hundred Musket Cartridges and one hundred and twenty Flint to be delivered over to Col<sup>l</sup> John Weems for the use of the Militia of Ann Arundel County. -

Friday 23<sup>d</sup> March 1701.

Ordered that the Armourer deliver to Robert Smith Esq. Forty Flint for the use of the Militia stationed at St. Anns and also Capt Gilbert Middleton of the Plate two hundred Musket Cartridges. -

That Capt Philomon Warfield deliver to Stephen Boone forty Muskets and Accoutrements to be by him delivered over to Major Joseph Munkin for the use of the Militia on the North side of Severn to be by him accounted for. -

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Robert Miles, Six pounds twelve Shillings and six pence of the new Emission due him per Account paid by the Dep<sup>y</sup> Aud. -

That James Galloway Esq. Six hundred and eighteen Bunches of Merchantable Flax for so much seized from him as a Agent for the Marine of France viz in the hands of John Smith Esq. three hundred & twenty nine bunches George and Thirty four Torman & Chambers eighty & the produce of two hundred & six bushels of wheat in
