

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Doney <sup>£100</sup> hundred and fifty pounds of the new Emission on Account -

That the said Treasurer pay to Col<sup>o</sup> Nathaniel Ramsey and <sup>£40</sup> Forest Commissioners for the preservation of Confiscated British property forty pounds of the same Emission on Account. -

That Capt<sup>o</sup> Philemon Warfield deliver to Col<sup>o</sup> Elijah Robinson thirty two stands of Arms and ten rounds of Cartridges to each stand for the use of the Militia of his Battalion & to be by him accounted for. -

That the Spring Commissary deliver to Capt<sup>o</sup> Alexander Duroman and Capt<sup>o</sup> Richard Doney, each, six Gallons of Rum and twenty four pounds of Sugar due them to the 31<sup>st</sup> Instant. -

Commissions issued to Joseph Chaplin appointed Capt<sup>o</sup>, James Hagline Lieut and Thomas Bramble Ensign also to Adam Ott Capt<sup>o</sup>, Nicholas Hooker Lieut and John Simpkins Ensign of the select Militia raised in Washington County and also to John Hyger second Lieut of Capt<sup>o</sup> John Funks Company in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion of Militia in the County aforesaid and also to George Hunter Capt<sup>o</sup>, Thomas Elliott first Lieut and David Stoddert second Lieut of a company of Militia formed for the Defense of the Harbour of Baltimore. -

Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> March 1701.

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Maj<sup>r</sup> J. M<sup>r</sup> Lane of Col<sup>o</sup> Lee's Corps five hundred Dollars of the new Emission on Account. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Col<sup>o</sup> Alexander Lawson Smith, Capt<sup>o</sup> Samuel M<sup>r</sup> Lane and Lieut Samuel Hanson of the Extra Regmt, each, fifty Pounds of the same Emission in lieu of twenty pounds specie part of their accounts passed by the Aud<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Joseph Middleton twelve pounds of the same Emission due him per Account passed by the Aud<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Allen Luyon one hundred and twenty six pounds, four shillings and three pence of the same Emission due him per Account passed by the Aud<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Frederic Green three hundred and seventy five pounds of the same Emission due him per Aud<sup>r</sup> passed by the Aud<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>.

That the said Treasurer pay to His Excellency Thomas M<sup>r</sup> Lee Esquire two hundred pounds of the same Emission on Account.

Ordered That the Armourer deliver to Lieut Col<sup>o</sup> James Postell six stands of Arms with accoutrements & sixty Cartridges on Account. -

That the Spring Commissary deliver to Capt<sup>o</sup> Horatio Flagell of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regt & Ensign John H<sup>r</sup> Lowe of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regmt each, eight Gallons of Rum and thirty two pounds of Sugar - Capt<sup>o</sup> John Mitchell of the 1<sup>st</sup> Regmt - twelve Gallons of Rum & twenty four pounds of Sugar & also to Capt<sup>o</sup> Nicholas M<sup>r</sup> Callister six Gallons of Rum & twenty four pounds of Sugar, due them to the first instant. -

That the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt<sup>o</sup> Horatio Flagell thirty three pounds, twelve shillings & nine pence of the new Emission due him per Aud<sup>r</sup> passed by the Aud<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>.
