belonging to the State, to be returned and if any way injured by him to be replaced by
another equally as good. —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Lieut Thomas Rouse of the
2^d Regiment Cloth and Trimmings for a Suit of Cloaths and Linen for two Shirts in
part for the year 1781. —

Commissions issued to Robert Bowie appointed Captain in the room of
John H. Deanes and also to John Harris Gibbs Ensign of Capt Richard Stonehuts
Company in the Lower Battalion of Militia in Prince Georges County. —
Wednesday 13th June 1781.

Ordered that the Young Commissary deliver to Major Aquila
Giles thirty four Gallons of Rum and one hundred and thirty six pounds of Sugar
due him to the first Instant. —

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to the said Major
Aquila Giles Cloth and Trimmings for a Suit of Cloaths and Linen for four
Shirts due him for the year 1780. —

Thursday 14th June 1781.

Ordered that the Commissary of Stores deliver to Capt Christian Myers
of the German Regiment Cloth and Trimmings for two Suits of Cloaths and Linen for
six Shirts in part of the articles allowed for the years 1780 & 1781.

Commissions issued to Benjamin Townsend appointed Captain, Thomas
MacLachlan Lieut and Richard Hodgson Cornet of a Troop of light Horse in said
County raised in virtue of the Act to encourage the raising a Volunteer Troop of Light
Horse in Baltimore Town and each County of this State. —

In pursuance of the Resolution of the General Assembly of the 13th June
1781. This Board took into Consideration the Case of John Hammond Cromwell and William
Groves and after deliberating on the Circumstances thereof, are of Opinion that the
going at large would be Dangerous to the State and therefore Order that John H^o
Cromwell be confined to the District of Betarara Hundred in said County and
William Groves to the District of Starford County not to depart the Limits thereof
without the Leave of the Governor and Council for the time being first had and
obtained and to be of good behaviour in the mean Time and that John Hammond
Cromwell enter into Bond with two good and sufficient Securities in the Penalty of
three thousand pounds Specie and William Groves in the Penalty of seven hundred
and fifty pounds Specie to comply with the said order and further that William Groves
give Bond with one other good Security in the penalty of one hundred pounds Specie
that his Son William Groves Jun^r be of good behaviour and conduct himself as
a good and faithful Subject of this State during the present War between America
and Great Britain —
