Lieut of Frederick County to be by him expended in the purchase of one hundred Saddles, Bridges, Mail Pulls, Valises & Holsters and Accounted for. —

That the said Treasurer pay to James Brui Esq. Three thousand three hundred and forty pounds, nine shillings and four pence specie agreeable to the "Act to Adjust the Debts due from this State" due him for Certificates as per Account passed by the Aid. Genl. the 17th July 1701.

That the said Treasurer pay to John and Samuel Davidson nineteen pounds, eleven shillings and ten pence specie agreeable to the said Act in lieu of Orders of the 5th May in favor of Genl. Smallwood and others and the 17 May in favor of William & Twin as settled by the Aid. Genl. the 5th and also Thirty three pounds, eighteen shillings and ten pence specie agreeable to the said Act per Account passed the 5th June by the Aid. Genl. —

That the Shipping Commissary deliver to Lieut John Chewer two Gallons of Rum and eight pounds of Sugar, Thomas & Marshall Gent. Thirty and an half Gallons of Rum and one hundred and fifty two pounds of Sugar — and also to Capt Richard Bird Twenty Gallons of Rum and eighty pounds of Sugar due to the 1st Instant

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Thomas & Marshall Gent. Cloth and Trimmings for a Suit of Cloaths and Linen for four Shirts for the present year. —

Henry Hawkins appointed Ensign of the Maryland Line the Rank to be settled hereafter. —

William Smith and Christian Kramer of Somerset County severally acknowledge themselves to owe and stand justly indebted to the State of Maryland in the full and just Sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds specie each to be levied of their Bodies, Goods Chattels, Lands and Tenements in case they and each of them do not make their personal appearance at the Special Court of Oyer and Terminer about to be held on the Eastern shore to Testify against George Mason, John Mason Samuel Tomlin and Babel Madding of Somerset County and not to depart therefrom without the leave of the Court. —
