

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to John Chalmers Seven pounds, fifteen shillings of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit not exceeding two hundred thousand pounds &c of the money appropriated for the present Campaign due him per Account passed by the Depy Audr -

That the said Treasurer pay to Jos^{ph} Peters eleven pounds thirteen shillings and nine pence of the same Emission of the money appropriated as aforesaid due him per Account passed by the said Genl -

That the said Treasurer pay to Robert Spibell, two pounds, fifteen shillings and three pence of the same Emission of the money appropriated as aforesaid due him per Act passed by the said Genl -

That the said Treasurer pay to Samuel Chas^{es} Esquires Thirty pounds of the same Emission of the money appropriated for the Defence of the State per Account passed by the Audr Genl -

That the said Treasurer pay to John Vardin thirteen pounds twelve shillings and six pence of the same Emission of the money appropriated for the payment of Expresses &c per Account passed by the Audr Genl -

The Governor and Council agreed this Day with John Dorey &c for six tons of good Merchantable sorted Cordage fit for a Gallies or such other use as the State may require, for which said Dorey and Company are to be paid at the rate of twenty pounds per pound of the new Emission as Specie - the money to be advanced the Cordage to be delivered whenever required to be made according to a Cordage Bill. -

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Samuel Chas^{es} Esquires one thousand pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit not exceeding two hundred thousand pounds &c of the money appropriated for the Defence of the State to be delivered over to John Dorey &c in payment for twelve thousand pounds of Cordage agreeable to the above contract.

On the Petition of Mary Arms of Charles County setting forth that she is a Widow and has three Children, one a son and the other two, Daughters, very small, that her son was Draughted on the 27th of July last, that he is the only support of her and her two Daughters, and that should he be obliged to march she and her two Daughters must be left in great Distress. It is therefore ordered that John Arms son of the aforesaid Mary Arms, be discharged from the Service for which he was Draughted. -

Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to Capt David Lym fifteen shillings of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit not exceeding two hundred thousand pounds &c of the money appropriated for the present Campaign for Stores on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to John Singleton five pounds five shillings of the same Emission of the money appropriated as aforesaid due him per Account passed by the Depy Audr -

That the said Treasurer pay to the Reverend Mr Armstrong Chaplain to the 2^d M^{ajors} Brigade Thirty pounds of the same Emission of the money appropriated as aforesaid on Account. -
