

Greenbury Simpson drafted from the 5th Regt of Militia in Anne Arundell County under the Act to raise two Battalions of Militia 2nd passed May Session 1781. Having made oath that he was drafted in the 47th Regt in said County under the Act passed October Session 1780 and procured John Jordan to enlist for the war to whom he gave Forty pounds, part Gold and part paper equal to Gold, and that he has a Mother forty odd years of age and three Sisters, the eldest about fourteen, who has not been able to do any thing for two years past, the next to her about 12 and the youngest about ten years of age, who depend on his labour only for support; is therefore discharged from the Duty for which he was drafted. —

Thursday 30th August 1781.

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Vardin six pounds, fifteen shillings and eleven pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit not exceeding 200,000 L^{rs} &c of the money appropriated for the present Campaign due him per Account passed by the Dep^y Aud^r. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Joseph Dowson, three hundred pounds of the same Emission, of the money aforesaid, to be delivered over to Capt Thomas Price Commissary of Frederick County for the use of his Department on And.

That the said Treasurer pay to the said Joseph Dowson, one hundred pounds of the same Emission of the money aforesaid to be delivered over to Philip Thomas Esquire Lieut. of Frederick County and by him forwarded to Moses Rawlings Dep^y Commissary of Washington County for the use of his Department and to be accounted for. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Brigadier General Gist one hundred and ten pounds of the same Emission of the money aforesaid to defray the Expenses incurred in transacting business entrusted to his care by General Greene to be charged to the Continent on Account and the further sum of one hundred and twenty six pounds like money to be delivered over to James Calhoun Commissary of Baltimore County on Account.

Warrants issued, directed to Donatson Yeates Quarter Master General David Poe Quarter Master Baltimore. James Tootell, Annapolis. — Thomas Beale George Town. — Samuel Maynard, Lower Marlboro'. — John Bolton Chester. — James Sullivan Dorchester. Charles Blake Queen Anne County. — Richard Dallam Hart and Hugh Hopewell, St. Marys County, empowering and requesting them to impress, all the Vessels capable of Transporting Troops or Military Stores, with their hands, provisions and Furniture, that are within any of the Rivers or Harbours of Chesapeake Bay and direct them immediately to repair to the Head of Elk, thence to receive orders from Mr Donatson Yeates Dep^y Quarters Master General. —

Friday 31st August 1781.

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Welch ten pounds, five shillings and three pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit not exceeding 200,000 L^{rs} &c of the money appropriated for the present Campaign per Account passed by the Dep^y Aud^r. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Lieut Robert Denny one thousand pounds of the same Emission, of the money aforesaid to be expended in the payment of Bounties to Recruits and to be accounted for. —
