Commission issued to Samuel Price appointed Major of the  
Gunpowder Battalion of Militia in Baltimore County. -

Henry Thomas a Draught from Kent County having made  
Oath, that he has a Wife and two small Children, the eldest between 6 and 7 years of  
age and the youngest about two months old, who depend on his labour only, for  
support, is therefore Discharged from the Duty for which he was draughted. -

William Handy a Draught from Worcester County having produced to  
the Board a Letter from a Number of Gentlemen of Worcester County setting  
forth that "W Handy has had the misfortune to lose a wife who has left
