

Saturday 29th June 1702

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Samuel Chew Esq. Forty five Pounds, eight shillings and ten Pence specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State for Certificates adjusted. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Jesse Hebb thirty nine Pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit due to be delivered over as follows twenty Pounds to Senate Divicul - eight Pounds to Jeremiah Gibson - five Pounds to Joshua Gibson and six Pounds to Herbert Blackiston the Bounty allowed for manufacturing Salt Fleet papers.

That the said Treasurer pay to Samuel Chew Esq. Forty five Pounds, eight shillings and ten Pence and Thomas Johnson jun. Five hundred and seven Pounds thirteen shillings and three Pence of the same Emission due on Certificates issued agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Col. Joseph Wood of the same Emission ten Pounds, six shillings and eight Pence for the use of Joseph Allsop and twelve Pounds, three shillings and four Pence for the use of Thomas Arkison, and Daniel Heck per Account passed -

That the said Treasurer pay to John Rusall nineteen Pounds ten shillings specie to pay for thirty gallons of Rum purchased by him of Apolam Magely for the Maryland Troops on the Celebration of the Birth of the Dauphin. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Henry Wickman two Pounds nineteen shillings and six Pence specie the Caution Money on Common Warrant for 170 Acres of Land located within the reserve of Monocacy Manor in Frederick County out of the first Money that may come into the Treasury. -

Commission issued to Peter Banick appointed Capt in the room of Valentine Fregar. John Banick of Handul First Lieut - Frederick Dewlbiss Second Lieut & Adam Link jun. Ensign in the Late 6th Battalion of Militia in Frederick County. -

Commission of Letters of Marque and Regual issued to William Beall Commander of the Schooner Alert fifty one Tons built and navigated by twelve men, mounting four Carriage Guns and two Swivels belonging to Samuel Inglis and Company in Philadelphia. -

Monday 1st July 1702

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Lieut Isaac Hanson eight Pounds twelve shillings of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit due for Stores to the 1st Instant on Account. -

That the said Treasurer pay to John Baker fifteen Pounds and nine pence of the same Emission due him per Account passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to pay to Thomas Beatty two hundred and forty two Pounds fifteen shillings and nine pence of the same Emission due on a Certificate issued agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State and also three Pounds three shillings and four pence of the same Emission for the use of John Miller per Account passed. -
