fifteen pounds specie to be delivered over to a Substant Gold, on Account

That the said Treasurer pay to George Ham four
hundred and eighteen pounds, fifteen shillings and ten pence specie
due him per Account passed.

I do hereby certify that it appears from the Records and
Proceedings of Durham County Court that a certain Hugh Kelly and Henry Miller
of Durham County were recognized on the 20th Day of February 1781 by Philip
Thomas then one of the Justices of the said Court in the sum of one hundred
pounds specie each for Hugh Kelly's Personal appearance at the then next County
Court to be held for the said County to answer such Objections as then and there
should be made against him on behalf of the State of Maryland and not to
depart. That the same Hugh Kelly did appear at the same Court and the
Recognition was repeated to the next Term but he not appearing there or at any
