Commission of Letters of Marque & Reprisal issued to Charles Harris Commander of the Ship Polly Tar, two hundred & eighty Ton burthen, navigated by fifty five Men, mounting fourteen Linnage Guns, belonging to Messrs. Henry Messerman & J. C. Zellerhoff of Baltimore. and to John Gray Commander of the Brigantine New Orleans, one hundred & fifteen Ton burthen, navigated by eighteen Men, mounting two Linnage Guns belonging to John Baptist McCarty of New Orleans & Robert Smith of the Havana. -

Saturday 7th September 1702

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to Alexander & Hanson Esqrs. ninety Pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit due in part of his Salary on Account

That the Young Commissary deliver to Mr. Paul Snyder Provisions for four Persons fifteen Days agreeable to an Order of the Secretary at War of the 15th January 1702. -

Monday 9th September 1702

The Flag Schooner Trimmer, having discharged her Load, has Permission to proceed to New York. She has on board six Bannels of Flour, four Bannels & four Hegg of Bread, three Bannels of Ham & one Banel of Tar and fourteen Hams. -

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to Catharine Subie six Pounds, eighteen shillings and some Pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit due per Account passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt John Middleton ten Pounds specie out of the money arising from the five shillings specie Tax for the purpose of providing forage due for the Honor procured under the Act entitled an Act to furnish twenty Dragoon Honor for the Southern Army on Account of the United States. -

This Board have agreed that Archibald Buchanan and John McLure shall have Permission to Ship five Tunnals hhd of Tobacco to New York on Account of the State on the Terms agreed by the Intendant and those Gentlemen to pay the Debt contracted by the Officers of the Maryland Army whilst in Captivity -

Tuesday 10th September 1702

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to John Lancaster thirty five Pounds, fourteen shillings & five Pence and Benjamin Ogdon forty eight Pounds, six shillings specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State due them on Certificates for Horses under the Act to procure an immediate supply of flesh Provisions and a sufficient number of Horses for light Horse & Linnage paid -

That the said Treasurer pay to Charles Macken eighty four Pounds & five pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit due on a Cert. issued agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State. -
