Thursday 26th September 1782

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to John  
Hinson one hundred and twenty Shillings specie due from the said paper  
And that the said Treasurer pay to Emily Holston, Mary  
Gunnels and also Adamson each three Dollars specie due them  
per Accounts passed -

And that the said Treasurer pay to Clement Lamont ten Pounds  
specie agreeable to the Act to acquit the debts due from this State per  
Account passed -

And that the said Treasurer pay to James Barrow eleven  
Pounds from a bill for and Mrs Paul and Elizabeth Haley twenty  
Pounds of the said bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of  
Credit due from them per Accounts passed -

And that the said Treasurer pay to the Commission of Letters of Marque and Reprisal issued  
to David Marshall Commander of the Schooner Pinkett, ninety  
seven Pounds on bills warranted by John Allen, mounting four Carriags  
guns belonging to David Stewart and others of Baltimore -
