

workmanlike manner on or before the first Day of February next, and to deliver the same to the Governor and Council, on their Order on the following Terms, that is to say, that the said Stephen Steward be allowed as a full compensation for his trouble, care and good management therein, the Commission of five per cent. upon all sums of money actually and bona fide expended in finishing and fitting the same and his reasonable Disbursements in procuring Materials. In Witness whereof the said Stephen Steward hath hereunto put his Hand this twenty seventh Day of September in the year of our Lord fourteen hundred and eighty two -

It is not understood that Sails and Rigging are to be procured by the Steward out of the Sum mentioned in the Agreement.

That the said Treasurer pay to Peter Whittingham, ten Pounds, ten shillings specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from per account passed. -

Monday 30<sup>th</sup> September 1782

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Nicholas Clin six Pounds and Lodowick Smith four Pounds three shillings and four Pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit due them per account passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Frederick Green four Pounds, eight shillings and six Pence specie for Postage of Letters per account passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to John Wilmot one Pound, two shillings and six Pence specie due him per account passed. -

That the Young Commissary deliver to Capt William Middleton two Barrels of Flour and one Barrel of Pork to be accounted for. -

The Bond of Thomas Contee with L. Mottiday Security, to this State given agreeable to the provisions of the Act of Assembly entitled "An Act to empower Thomas Contee to settle & collect the Debts due to William a Hollister and Robert a Hollister or either of them and to apply the same" is approved by the Governor and Council and lodged with the Bond. -
