

Ordered that the western shore treasurer pay to Robert Appligate fifty four pounds eighteen shillings seven pence due from us Steward on board the sloop Boat 20th Nov per account passed -

Friday 4<sup>th</sup> October 1782

Ordered that the western shore treasurer pay to Robert Bowie twenty five pounds fifteen shillings and seven pence specie out of the money arising from the five shillings seven pence agreeable to the Act to furnish the Southern Army with twenty Dragoon Troops per account passed -

That the said treasurer pay to Col<sup>l</sup> William Fitzhugh six pounds and to Elizabeth Kargill thirty pounds specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Act<sup>s</sup> passed -

That the said Treasurer pay to Captain Walker thirty two pounds five shillings - Ensign Henry Chapin ten pounds five shillings - Lieut Walter Dyer thirteen pounds five shillings and six pence - Lieut Robert Walker - Hon<sup>ble</sup> six pounds eleven shillings and three pence - Capt William Bruce thirty pounds four shillings and Ensign Edward Hamilton twenty pounds eighteen shillings and six pence specie, out of the money that came from the Havana cut into the Treasury by Major General Smallwood to be by them accounted for and charged to the United States -

That the said Treasurer pay to John Rivers three pounds thirteen shillings and four pence and Thomas Billingham five pounds six shillings and eight pence specie out of the money appropriated for the Barges and them per account passed -

That the said Treasurer pay to Sergeant Solomon Brown and two pounds five shillings specie for the Passage of four Continental Soldiers from Baltimore per account passed -

That the said Treasurer pay to Margaret Halland seven pounds seventeen shillings and six pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit per account passed -

Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October 1782

Ordered that the western shore treasurer pay to Thomas and Eleanor Adams one hundred and forty six pounds and shillings & seven pence specie amount to be cut to order to State due from this State per stipulated account and passed -

Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> October 1782

Ordered that the western shore treasurer pay to Capt Horatio Bagnet twenty nine pounds two shillings and nine pence and Lieut Gortcham forty two pounds and nine pence specie out of the money that came from the Havana cut into the Treasury by Major General Smallwood to be by them accounted for and charged to the United States -
